Happy June!

Summer is finally here, and business has been ramping up! We began the month of May by hosting Derby Day on the 6th, filled with Mint Juleps, Kentucky Oaks Lilies, Southern fare, wagers, and an outstanding costume contest (one of my favorite parts!). The Madison & Highway Clean-Up was also held on the sixth. On this day, the POW flag on our memorial wall was replaced, clean-up of our building's perimeter took place including repair of our fence, and thanks to our Commander, Jason Boynton, many of our local residents in need of new American flags, received a beautiful new flag. During highway clean-up, one of our Post Members stumbled across a torn \$100 bill, which the bank was able to accept, so it was donated to our General Fund!

On the 13th, Pup Tent 41 kicked off Brat Fry Season, which was followed by a brat fry on the 20th, Armed Forces Day, when we welcomed the US Military Veterans Motorcycle Club to our Post to host their annual brat fry. The fun didn't stop there, thanks to our Quartermaster and Past Commander, Jon Russell, as he hosted our 15th Annual Golf Outing at Door Creek Golf Course. This event raised a whopping record of \$3,356 for our Relief Fund!

On May 21st we hosted the Madison Maennerchor's 171st Annual Spring Concert in our main hall. With all sorts of German beer flowing, it was an excellent event! Their next performance will be in June at the Madison Masonic Center, keep an eye out for specific date and time in your local newspapers.

Monday, May 22nd, we held our first Meat Raffle of the year, raising \$375 for the General Fund!

We were pleasantly surprised on Thursday, May 25th, when our new sign for out front arrived a day early! Because of this, our House Committee elected to have two cabinets equipped with LED lights, the copyrighted VFW logo, and a message welcoming the public. Special thanks goes to our House Committee Chair, AJ Feucht, for his time and attention to this important piece of our business!

Lastly, and most importantly, we honored our Fallen on Memorial Day. The Black Knights and Madison Dayettes began with a ceremony at Monona Grove High School, followed by marching in the Monona Memorial Day Parade.
