And lastly the auxiliary said goodbye to a member at her Celebration of Life on December 28th, Sharon Alice Bronson. You will be missed.



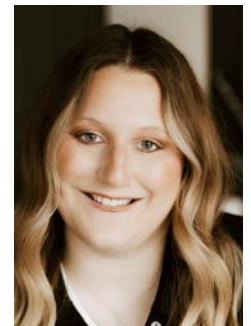

Past Post Commander Dies

Russell Joseph “Russ” Jenkins, age 76, of McFarland, passed away on December 26, 2024, at Brookdale Senior Living in Sun Prairie, Wis.

Russ was born on February 6, 1948, at St. Joseph’s Hospital in Dodgeville, Wis., the son of Edgar R. and Elma A. (Richter) Jenkins. He grew up in Highland, Wis., and was a 1966 graduate of Highland High School. He married the love of his life, Bonnie Ann Benson, on November 15, 1969, at St. Thomas Catholic Church in Montfort, Wis.

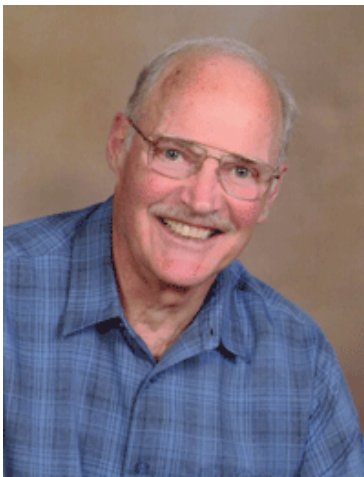

He volunteered with the Coalition for the Elderly and could always be relied upon to help out a neighbor or anyone in need.

Russ is survived by his loving wife of 55 years, Bonnie; son, Craig Jenkins (Kate) of Montfort, Wis., and grandchildren, Madison (Chris), Lauren (Ben) and Josie; daughter, Lori Jenkins (Doug Tiedt) of Oregon, and grandchildren, Alex, Anna, and Gracie. He is also survived by his siblings, Carlos Jenkins, Marilyn (Roger) Neuhoff, Mary Pyle, Fritz Jenkins and Doug Jenkins; sister-in-law, Connie Gust; brother and sister-in-law, David and Margaret Benson; along with many nieces, nephews, godchildren, cousins and countless friends.

He was preceded in death by his parents; his brother and sister-in-law, Gordon and Beverly Jenkins; sister and brother-in-law, Rita Mae and Kenric Schmitz; brother-in-law, Jerry Gust; and sister-in-law, Judy Jenkins.



Russ enjoyed fishing the local lakes, deer hunting in the ‘swamp’ with Craig and Tom, and BS’ing with the boys at deer camp. He treasured the time with his Army family and trips to Washington D.C. and Branson, Mo. Russ especially enjoyed watching his grandchildren participate in their activities.

A Mass of Christian Burial will be held at Immaculate Heart of Mary Catholic Church, 5101 Schofield St., Monona, at 11 a.m. on Saturday, January 4, 2025. Full military honors will follow the Mass. A luncheon will follow military honors at VFW POST 7591, 301 Cottage Grove Road, Madison, on Saturday. A visitation will be held at GUNDERSON EAST FUNERAL AND CREMATION CARE, 5203 Monona Drive, Madison, from 3 p.m. until 7 p.m. on Friday, January 3, 2025, with Pass and Review at 6 p.m. A private inurnment will take place at the mausoleum at Roselawn Memorial Park.
