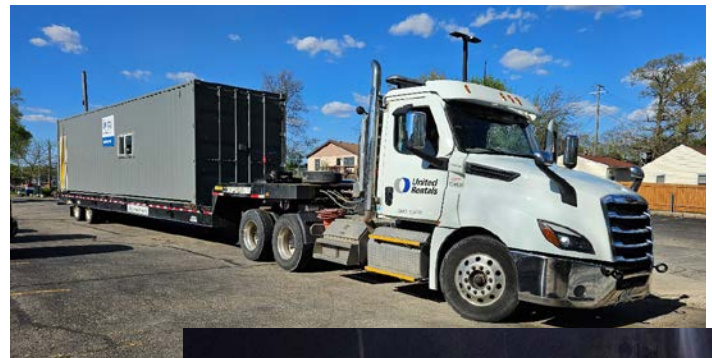

On May 6th, the Post received a brand-new shipping



container from United Rentals to store its brat fry supplies, outdoor tools, seasonal tools and supplies, etcetera. It is 40' long, 8' wide, and 9' high. We purchased this unit, and it was paid for with the bingo fund. Jerry Lundquist has built the first set of shelves to organize the brat fry supplies. Kerry McAllen and Leigh Logan are working on ordering stairs for the man-door, and other punch-list items to complete this project.

Critical Programs

We recruited two new and five reinstated members.

One member was upgraded to silver legacy life: Joe Ellis. Five members were upgraded to bronze legacy life: John Looze, Larry Taft, Chue Fue Moua, and Jon Russell.

Adopt a Unit Program. We helped plan and organize Toys for Tots, an annual event in collaboration with the Marine Reserves. This event required scores of volunteer hours and culminated in a day-long event in December at our post which raised \$4,128 and 24 boxes of toys.

Student Veterans Program. We maintained a relationship with two student veteran programs this year: The MATC Student Veterans Group, and The University of Wisconsin ROTC.

In August, our post donated \$500.00 to the MATC Student Veterans Group for their food bank. We also signed up two members due to this relationship: Sam Moen and Shawn Moen.

On October 12, we held a brat fry for the MATC Student Veterans Group and donated the funds to their scholarship fund.

UW ROTC volunteered during our Tuesday bingo. We donated \$500.00 to them.

Additional Programs

Our post achieved Red-carpet and attended the Mid-Winter Conference. Ten of our post and auxiliary members attended the conference.

The Chatter won the National VFW Bronze Award for Large Frequency Post/District Newsletter.

We recognized several commemorative dates in our monthly newsletter and with public toasts at our canteen.

Our post held two recruiting events. The first was held late summer at the Madison Farmer's Market on the Capitol Square. The second was held on November 1st at the Madison Hmong New Year put on by the Wisconsin Hmong Association.

We hosted two family friendly events; our first annual Trunk or Treat on Halloween for over 60 kids, and Toys for Tots during the Christmas season which featured a story hour for the kids and Santa Claus.

Post Donations

Our post held 12 brat fries and donated thousands of dollars to other veteran groups.

We donated \$7,984.99 from our relief funds.

Operation Ruck 22 donated \$17,000 to Custom Canines, Rivers of Recovery, Hero Center, and Wisconsin Veterans Fishing Camp.

Donated \$1,078 to The Marine Corps League

\$1,600.00 to Heat and Housing for Heros.

Extra Participation of the VFW in the Community

Our color guard consists of 26 post and auxiliary members. Since May, 2024 it participated in 28 events, volunteered over 800 hours, and traveled all over Dane County as well as to Waubesa for Flag Day.

We have five post members on the Madison Firing Squad. Since July, these members have participated in over 86 funerals and volunteered over 670 hours.

Operation Ruck 22 held its annual event on October 13th at our post home for approximately 100 participants and raised \$17,000. The mission of this group is to raise awareness of the veteran suicides that occur daily then raise funds to donate to local organizations that aim to reduce suicides.

We held a food drive in support of Second Harvest Food Bank from October and donated two and a half barrels of food during the NBC15 Share Your Holidays kickoff event.

We hosted the annual Jam-4-Cans fundraiser on November 9th to benefit The River Food Pantry.

On February 13th we honored our VOD and Patriot Pen winners, and we presented scholarship funds to them.

Members hosted a book reading event in the Middleton Public Library in February.

We held four blood drives at our post in June, October, December, and April, collected 35 units of blood.

Post highway cleanup on April 26th on Hwy BB from Sprecher Rd. to Vilas Hope Rd. Twenty volunteers participated.

VFW Day of Service on May 3rd. We helped Lake View Elementary School build a bike path in their school forest from 10am – 2pm.

We have a Scout of the Year whom we recognized at our May post meeting on the 8th with a certificate and a \$300 scholarship.

Our post was the January and March Division 1 State Membership Challenge Winner

We held our 17th annual golf outing fundraiser and raised over \$6,000 for our relief fund.

We retired over 350 US flags for community members.

We retired 36 funeral US flags for Roselawn Cemetery and provided new ones in preparation for Memorial Day.

Decorated over 4,000 graves at Roselawn Cemetery on May 22nd.

Dedicated the Day Post Tribute Wall on May 24th.

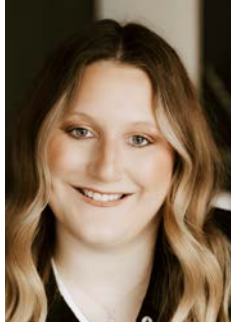

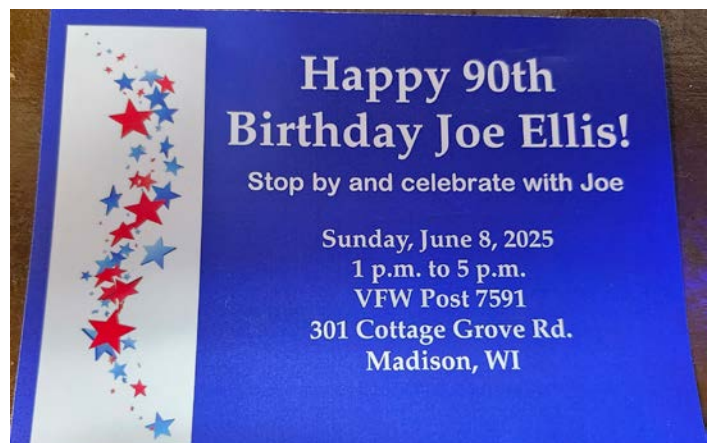

Chaplain's Corner

Blessing Your Family Pet

You know well enough we become attached to our family pets; this chaplain in particular has grown fonder of our fur babies the older I get. A pet blessing ceremony celebrates the relationship between these family members. It often invokes spiritual guidance to wish our animals good health, happiness, and protection. These ceremonies are not only for sick or aging pets; they can be a joyful event to honor the bond that pets share with their owners.

A successful pet blessing ceremony relies on setting the right tone with the pet owner's beliefs, whether religious, spiritual, or entirely secular. The tone could be solemn and reflective for a pet nearing the end of life, or lighthearted and joyful for a healthy pet's milestone celebration. Setting the correct atmosphere ensures that the ceremony is meaningful for everyone involved. Selecting the location is important as well such as a backyard, park, or animal sanctuary. Natural settings are often ideal as they allow pets to feel comfortable in a familiar or relaxing environment. Outdoor ceremonies, weather permitting, also offer space for guests and their animals to move freely.

Pets can be unpredictable, so being prepared for unexpected situations. Animals may become restless, anxious, or even excited during the event. Offering water and treats for the animals and ensuring there is a space for them to relax during the ceremony are good strategies to keep pets comfortable.

Concluding the pet blessing ceremony is an opportunity to reflect on the relationship between the pet and its owner. A final blessing or well-wishing can affirm the spiritual and emotional bond that has been honored during the ceremony. A closing prayer, a moment of silence, or a communal reflection may serve as a way to close the event. They offer a special opportunity for owners to honor their pets and share a spiritual experience that can create lasting memories.

- Grains: instant oatmeal, pasta, instant/microwavable rice, low-fat low-sugar granola bars

- Proteins (the most needed category): low-sodium canned chicken, canned tuna in water, unsalted nuts/seeds, reduced sodium peanut butter/nut butters, low or no sodium canned beans (northern, kidney, black, etc.)
- Beverages: bottled water, tea, instant coffee
- Other: low sodium broths or soups (hearty, thick soups most needed), low sodium pasta sauces, olive oil, canola oil, salt-free seasonings or dried herbs/spices, can openers, microwavable meals/pasta dishes
